TechSoup New Zealand is a not-for-profit organisation that works to help New Zealand charitable organisations to understand technology. They work with world leading IT suppliers to provide charitable organisations with donated and discounted computers and software.

MENZSHED NZ is a member of Techsoup and that has provided subsidised access to the GoToMeeting software we currently use for online meetings and the Windows8 operating system upgrades. Some sheds are also members.

MENZSHED NZ has taken up the Google NFPs offer which provides free access to some Google commercial products including online storage, collaboration tools and emails. As a result we will shortly be changing all email addresses to the format <u>chairman@menzshed.nz</u>. That change will result in a reduction in overheads and implements a suggestion received during the AGM of using free alternatives for email. We will also be looking at replacing GoToMeeting with Google products, again a cost saving as suggested at the AGM.

# Membership benefits

The executive has endeavoured to achieve benefits for member sheds nationally and has been successful with the companies shown on the website <u>http://menzshed.org.nz/membership/benefits/</u>. We have not been successful with the major DIY companies as most prefer to provide community support at the local level.

Rothbury's and FairDinkum have donated directly to MENZSHED NZ and that assists in keeping membership fees to a low level. FairDinkum and Carba-Tec have also indicated that they will support the 2016 conference. If you are looking for insurance, tools or new sheds it is worth checking with them.

An agreement with NZ Safety that will provide member shed discounts across all products is still being finalised.

The website is also a significant benefit to sheds in providing a unified point where the public can find out about men's sheds and the location of sheds in their area. # **MENZSHED NZ Executive priorities**

Priorities in no particular order and progress to date are:

- <u>1.</u> Template guide for sheds on how to approach local authorities. Regional reps should be your first contact. Peter Blackler (Treasurer) is also available as a contact.
- 2. Guidelines for setting up a shed.

A start has been made on this with a website page and links to information from Community Law. <u>http://menzshed.org.nz/library/setting-up-shed/</u>

There is also available the Australian Men's Shed Association manual that contains a lot of relevant information on setting up a shed and also Safety. You can download a copy at <u>AMSA</u>



A good start in where to obtain funding in NZ can be found at <u>Fundview</u>. You can also access Fundview through some online library facilities.

- <u>3.</u> Health and Safety See the new documents on the website <u>http://menzshed.org.nz/library/safety/</u>
- <u>4.</u> Access to research, health and other benefits There is some existing research on the website <u>http://menzshed.org.nz/library/research/</u>

The executive supported Jenny Moore in her research initiative and selected sheds will have received shed and personal questionnaires. A report on this is due later this year.

The AMSA conference is also expected to contribute in this area.

- 5. Reduce overheads as a way of keeping membership costs down As mentioned elsewhere, the move to Google Apps for free mail and replacement of the GoToMeeting product will reduce overheads.
- 6. Updating our database of sheds and contact information and enabling shared access amongst the MENZSHED NZ Executive. Our secretary will soon contact each shed separately for more information.
